I am delighted to welcome you to our festival of celebration to mark the 75th Anniversary of Impington Village College.

The College originally opened in 1939 within days of the declaration of World War 2. The remarkable Grade 1 Listed Building was born from the meeting of two visionary thinkers. Walter Gropius, who was arguably the leading architect in the world at the time, fled Nazi Germany in 1934 when he came to London to join an architectural partnership with Maxwell Fry. At the same time the innovative educationalist Henry Morris was negotiating investment and land to build three new Village Colleges in Cambridgeshire. Morris believed that the Village College building should act as 'the silent teacher', offering a welcoming and inspiring space for local community of all ages to learn and socialise. When Gropius was introduced to Morris he was so inspired by the concept of the Village College that he agreed to design it. The result is the iconic building that still stands at the heart of Impington Village College.

We continue to welcome visitors from across the globe to admire both the building, and to be part of the work that we do today. Through the main College, International Sixth Form Centre, Community and Adult Learning programme, and the Sports Centre we strive to be inspirational, inclusive and international.

The Impington75 Festival includes a range of events, activities and projects for our community to enjoy. I hope you will join us in celebration of all that is IVC; past, present and future.

Gropius Restoration Pledge

The Grade 1 Listed Gropius Building at IVC is currently undergoing some important restoration work. Funding has been secured from the Heritage Lottery Fund and the Wolfson Foundation, with crucial support and seed funding from the PSFA.

To help match the grant award requirement the Henry Morris Memorial Trust has pledged 400 books to the College. The books will be available from September with all profits contributing directly to the restoration programme.

If you have any fond memories of IVC, feel you owe a debt of gratitude in any way, or would simply like to support the preservation of this important building please pledge $\mathfrak{L}10$. In return you will receive a copy of the new biography telling the colourful story of Morris's creation of the Village Colleges. The Importance of Impington

Impington Village College has the distinction of being the only public building in the UK designed by Walter Gropius, founder of the Bauhaus.

When it opened 75 years ago the design of the Village College was very radical, bringing new ideas that had never been seen before. It paved the way for a whole new approach to public buildings, bringing the modernist movement in architecture to Britain. The Village College at Impington drew interest from all over the world, and in 1939 the British Council commissioned a series of photographs to document the building. Buildings of the Future

What will our schools and communities look like in the future? The Royal Institute of British Architects in the East region has been running schools workshops to find out what young people think. In June a series of workshops led by RIBA Architects took place in partner primary schools in Histon and Impington, Girton, Oakington and Milton. The students created imaginative models of underground and tree top dwellings, zero-gravity football pitches, and buildings with a whole range of eco inventions. The youngsters worked with IVC International Sixth Form students to explore different material and create imaginative spaces. Sensory Room Appeal

To mark the 75th Anniversary the Special Educational Needs Department at IVC has set themselves a challenge; to raise funds to support a new sensory room at Impington Village College. The space will then need to be kitted out with items such as fibre optic lights, music making kit and bubble tubes costing in the region of $\mathfrak{L}11,000$. 


Cambridge & Impington Tang Soo Do Club
